

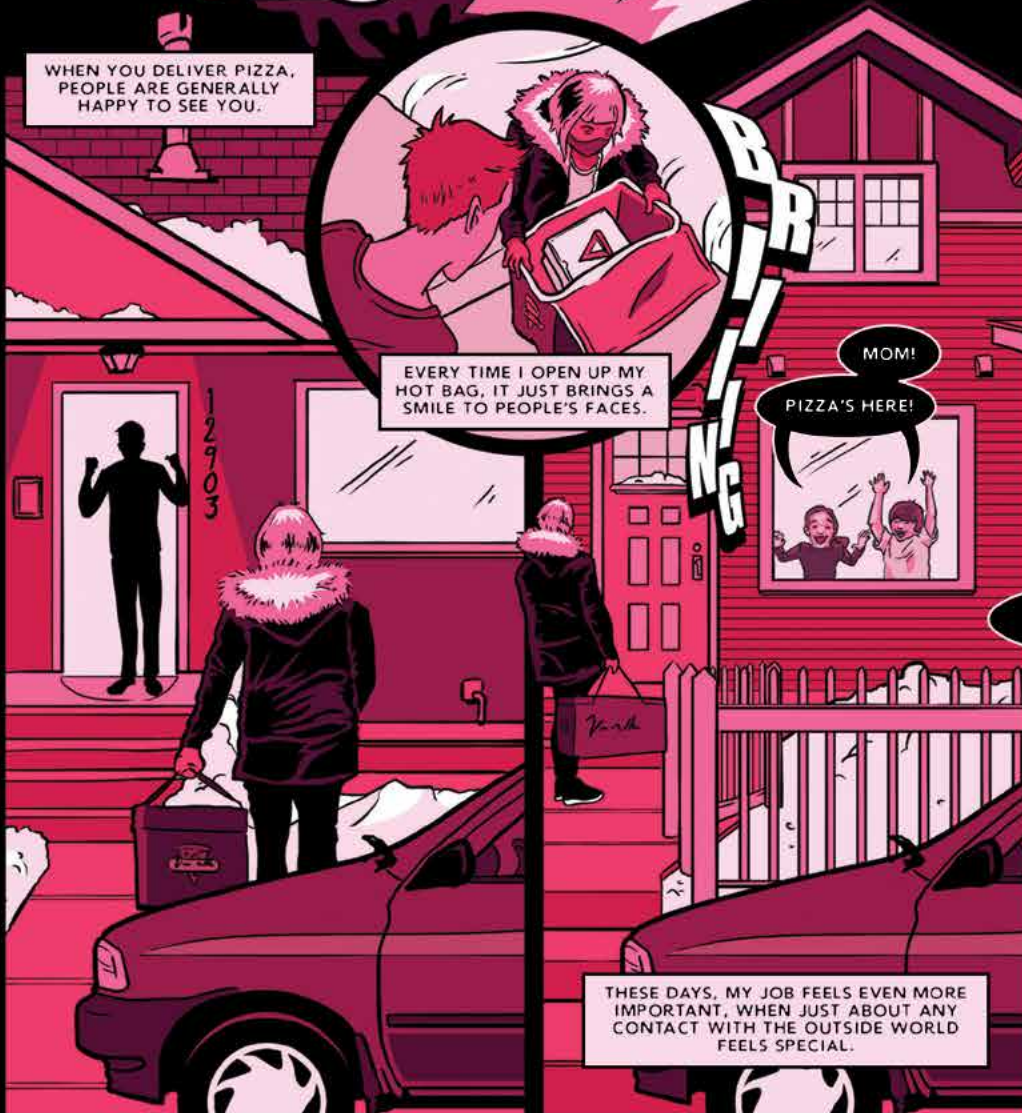

GOT ROOM FOR TWO MORE? JUST PAST THE HENDAY. SHOULDN'T TAKE YOU LONG.

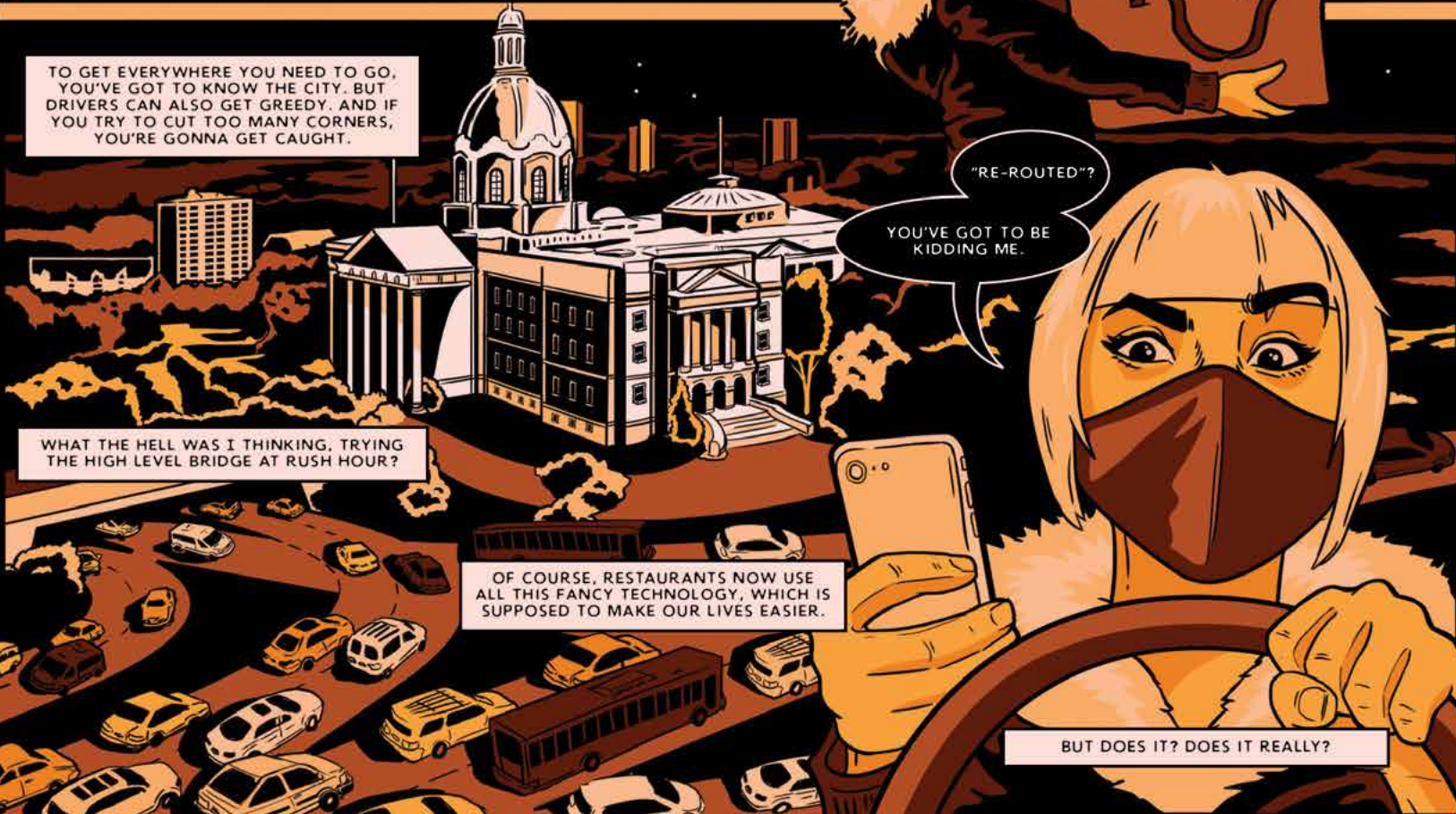
\*SIGH\*

OR BRINGING A SURPRISE ORDER TO PEOPLE WHO REALLY DESERVE IT.

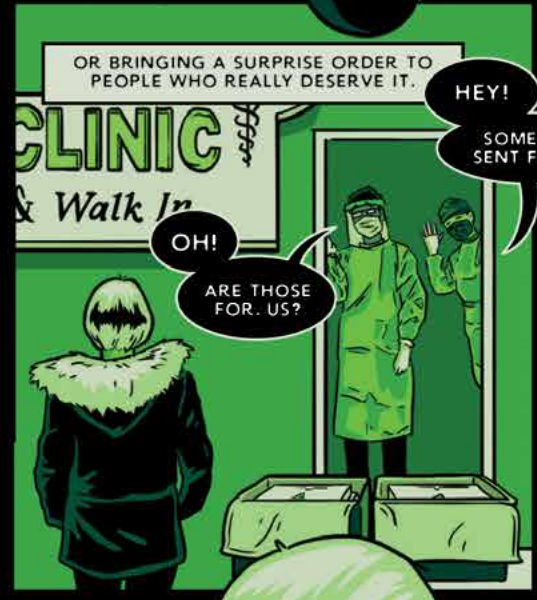
BECAUSE IN THE END, WHEN YOU DELIVER PIZZA, PEOPLE ARE HAPPY TO SEE YOU.
